<p>Writing</p>	<p>All SCHS students receive instruction in writing throughout their four years. Multiple writing is assigned focuses on varying audiences and purposes. Additionally, courses are offered in AP Language, AP Literature. Journalism and Drama within the ELA department. An enrichment Yearbook Red Zone is currently in place that serves students who have met college ready benchmarks and wishes to work on compiling the yearbook. Also ELA teachers and SBDM members are currently working on reviewing and revising the school’s current writing policy. It will be uploaded to KDE prior to the January 15, 2019 deadline. Additionally SCHS ELA & Science teachers have partnered with UK College of Agriculture & LIKEN to explore creative ways of gathering stories of home, the woods, creeks, and other special places in Martin County. They will develop skills in writing, verbal expression, music, videography, and Mapping (GIS).</p>
<p>Global Competency/World Language</p>	<p>SCHS offers only one World Language program – Spanish. Spanish I, II and AP courses are offered to students throughout their high school career. However, other courses focus on global readiness for CCR, specifically through Jobs for Kentucky Graduates (JKG), Health Sciences Program and IT courses. Also through AP Environment Sciences, Aeronautics/Aerospace students are prepared for global readiness. There are additional opportunities for students to gain exposure to World Language opportunities through discussions on foreign affairs in History or romance languages in English. There are also connections made through presentations by our foreign exchange students. Latin terms are introduced through both science and Medical Terminology. Often our school play has global implications as well.</p>
<p>Visual & Performing Arts</p>	<p>Courses in Music Theory, Choir, Band, Advanced Art, dual-credit Fine Arts, General Art, History of Visual & Performing Arts (HVAPA) are offered. Students study Performing Arts one semester under the band/choir teacher and then rotate into visual arts with the art teacher. Students may participate in multiple courses from these areas. Also, through the JKG program, media arts is offered. Students participate in videography, live streaming varying events occurring in the school and at sporting events. A musical production is performed at least once a year. This normally encompasses 100-200 students. “Shrek” the musical will be performed April 15-20, 2019. Performances are staged for all schools within the district on varying days, night productions for the community as well as dinner shows are offered.</p>
<p>Practical Living & Career Studies (PLCS)</p>	<p>Ninth grade Physical Education is offered as well as JROTC. Health and dual-credit college Health is added. Career & Technical Education Pathways are offered in Carpentry, Auto Tech, Electricity, Business Administration, Culinary Arts, Aeronautics/Aerospace, Pilot program in Teaching & Learning, Pre-Nursing, Pharmacy Tech, EKG Tech, AP Computer Science Principles, Coding & Web Site Design & Development. The opportunity to achieve both academic and career readiness is available to all students. Some students pursue multiple pathways with courses and certifications which provide a seamless</p>

	transition from secondary to postsecondary programs or entry level positions. Project based learning with an authentic audience is ongoing throughout the programs at the Area Technology Center.
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
