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Martin County School District always has the health and well-being of our students and staff at the forefront each day. To be clear and transparent we want to notify you of some positive cases of COVID-19 in our school community.

This morning we were notified of three new positive cases of COVID-19 among students in the Martin County School District. One case at each of the following schools: Warfield Elementary, Martin County Middle School and Martin County High School. We are working with the Martin County Health Department to perform contact tracing and notify anyone who may have been in contact with the students. Extra cleaning and thorough sanitation is on going and will be continued in order to prevent the spread of the virus.

Due to the increased cases within our school population and community, we will return to virtual learning beginning Friday, October 16, 2020. We will reevaluate the return to in-person classes as cases begin to decline in Martin County. Students who have been receiving in-person instruction will transition back to google classroom and those who have been virtual learners (Edgenuity and Apex) will continue their curriculum. Meal delivery will beginning Monday, October 19, 2020. Meals are scheduled for delivery each day next week.

Please watch your children for common symptoms of the virus: fever, cough, headaches, body aches and shortness of breath. Once in-person classes resume, do not send your children to school if you believe your child has had exposure to the virus or they are awaiting test results for COVID-19. Contact your health care provider if you have any questions or concerns.
